SHAVUOT: HOW SHOULD WE STUDY TORAH THAT WE MAY ACQUIRE A HEART OF WISDOM?

s we approach Shavuot in 2023, it is a great time to reflect on the significance of Torah study in our lives as Jews. For many, studying Torah provides a profound understanding of Jewish history and the relationship between the Jewish people and God. Shavuot serves as a reminder of the early stages of this relationship and the vital role of Torah study in gaining a deeper appreciation of it.

Nevertheless, Torah study is not merely about amassing knowledge. It is about putting that knowledge into practice and utilizing it in our daily lives. As we gather on Shavuot to study Torah, let us keep in mind that it is not about the level of knowledge or practice of our community members. Instead, it is about joining forces with individuals of all ages and levels of expertise to receive God's word in a new light. We must value the diversity of our community and recognize that together, we can create our own story and locate our place in Jewish history.

This year, let us approach Torah study with an open mind and heart, and remember the significance of community in our quest to comprehend and live out the values and ideals of our faith.

Remember, the way we study and approach the wisdom of our Torah is also a reflection of how we as Jews, understand the world around us.

PICKING AND CHOOSING

hen I lived in Israel, another student and I decided we wanted to explore the Mount of Olives. This is the very large and very old cemetery that sits atop the hill in full view of the Temple Mount, from which you can view the Dome of the Rock and Al Aqsa Mosque. This cemetery is considered sacred in our religion, because according to the book of Isaiah, when the Messiah finally arrives; he will walk through this cemetery on his way to the Temple, bringing back to life all those he encounters along the way. Many famous people are buried here, and because it is important to all three Abrahamic religions, it has become quite the tourist spot.

So, my friend and I booked a guided tour, and right before we entered the actual cemetery one man who was accompanied by his wife, spoke up. "Excuse me!" he said. "I am Jewish, and I am actually a Kohen. This means that I'm not allowed to actually enter into the cemetery, as my religion prohibits it." As soon as he said this, his wife took the opportunity to give him a quick slap across the chest. "That didn't stop you from eating the ham sandwich the other day!" she retorted.

When it comes to religious practice, no matter our level of observance, we all tend to pick and choose what halachic practices we choose to engage with. I used to try and make sense of all the various levels of kashrut or Shabbat people held, but I finally gave up. Perhaps what broke me was watching all the Orthodox Jews in Los Angeles drive their cars a block away from their synagogue on Shabbat, only to park and walk a little bit to appear as if they had walked the whole way!

God tells us repeatedly through the prophets that He is incensed when people adhere to the letter of the law, but still oppress the stranger or the widow. He says that our sacrifices detest Him when we still pervert justice. In this sense, according to God, just keeping the law isn't good enough.

I tell our students all the time that the mitzvah God cares most about is treating other people the way they would want to be treated. This seems to be emphasized by Rabbi Hillel who was asked to summarize the Torah while he stood on one foot. "What is hurtful to your neighbor, do not do. The rest of the Torah is just commentary," he said.

So, while we get involved in the process of picking and choosing, I hope the one value we'll always pick is being kind to others. However, we should still lay off the ham sandwiches!

ear Temple Beth Sholom Community, I want to thank you all for giving me the opportunity to be the Director of the Judy and Ronald Mack School for the Religious Studies for these past three years. While I will be changing jobs and changing states, I will never forget the time we shared together and all the memories we created in Las Vegas.

When I assumed the role of Director in April of 2020, the world had become a very tumultuous place. Because no one had experienced this type of lockdown before, it was a strange time to navigate handling a Religious School that couldn't meet in person. Likewise, it was unclear when or if the school could reopen, and what it would look like. With the help of my Religious School teachers and with the advice of the TBS Board of Directors, we decided to start a hybrid program that would both meet in person or via Zoom for the 2020-2021 school year. We strive to make learning fun and make an effort to hold events both during and after school to engage our students in a love of Torah and tradition.



Our students build friendships with their classmates and teachers and make meaningful relationships that will continue to blossom throughout their lifetimes. Temple Beth Sholom is a great starting point in building young Jewish identities.

I could not have made this happen without the support of the Mack family, or without the support of my amazing team of teachers. Lastly, I couldn't have done this without the support and faith of all the families who entrusted me to teach their children the most precious aspects of our religion and tradition. Thank you to all who believed in me, comforted me, and encouraged me. While I was tasked with teaching your kids, they ended up teaching me so much as well.




LIAM MINUSKIN JUNE 3RD, 2023




ETHAN KOVE JUNE 10TH, 2023
