PURIM, SPIDERMAN AND VOLODYMYR ZELENSKYY... WHAT DO JEWISH HEROES LOOK LIKE?



As I struggled to try on my brand new Spiderman outfit for Purim I realized that I could have chosen many other different outfits that did not involve the use of spandex. I was trying to order my costume on line and I found myself exchanging emails with a costumer service representative in a far away country. After agreeing to the quality of the spandex he proceeded to ask me as to what kind of Spiderman suit I wanted: "Will it be the classic Spiderman, maybe The Spiderman comes home suit? Perhaps the black and white Spiderman? "No," I wrote, "just fat Spiderman will be ok, something that fits me!"

We wear costumes on Purim to remind us of the type of miracle that God performed for The Jewish People in Persia. God's face remained hidden throughout the entire story. The story is poignant because it reminds us that without human beings helping themselves, many times God is unable to help. One of the most undeniable traits of freedom of choice is that when we make the wrong choices the consequences that follow have little to do with God and much to do with us. This is how I chose to see the story of Purim. What makes Mordechai and Esther true heroes is the ability to take charge of their own story and control the narrative. Mordechai and Esther both refuse to have others write their story for them.

When we look at our world today it is easy to be disheartened by what is happening around us. The situation in Ukraine is indeed something that none of us could have imagined happening in the midst of the Twenty First Century. Europe again at war, refugees, the indiscriminate murder of civilians! At the center of the drama a soft spoken, medium built Jewish man who seems to be eight feet tall. Volodymyr Zelenskyy,

The President of Ukraine has emerged as one of those once in a lifetime historical figures that inspires not only his own people but the entire world. Not unlike in the story of Purim, he understands that the survival of his people depends on acting as if everything depends on him and those around him. We can pray for The Ukrainian People all day long but ultimately human actions will determine what ultimately happens to them. They are defending their country and their lives heroically and we from the sidelines have the God assigned obligation to not remain silent and to make sure that all that can be done is done to help them defend themselves.

When we look at the images on our television screens it is impossible not to feel pain, anger and frustration. Remember, the face of God is hidden in the faces of all those fighting for their lives, fighting for good to triumph over evil. The face of God is hidden in the faces of the few fighting against the many. This is a lesson that we as Jews understand more than anyone else on this world.

I pray that the ultimate message of our Purim observance, beyond the unrestrained joy that historical survival brings about is that God allows us to feel God's presence in our actions as we try to make our life a blessing to help all who need our help.

I DID IT MY WAY

As a Rabbi, I tend to be in the cemetery more than the average person. Not only in one particular cemetery by the way; no, when you're clergy in Las Vegas—you tend to do a circuit of various graveyards all over town. Every one of them is unique, with its own feel and layout. To the laymen, I supposed every cemetery is the same, but if you're the one officiating the service, you quickly realize that each cemetery has its own character.

However, the one thing I have noticed about Las Vegas cemeteries in particular is a similar inscription found on many of the headstones. When I initially saw it I thought it was clever, but now it is so common-place. I'm beginning to wonder if the joke is on me. It's simply five words from the popular song that Frank Sinatra made famous: "I Did It My Way."

Now I understand this totally makes sense to put on a headstone. Seemingly, each grave marker presents all that is left of one's journey in life. Many of the tombstones attempt to tell a story about who the person was; what they loved and how they lived. Of course, every individual is unique and the life they led was also unique. However, there is something ironic about the idea that the most common phrase left embroidered on a headstone is, "I Did It My Way" because apparently everyone else did it that way too!

This phrase presents a very telling notion about the human psyche. We all tend to think that our experience on this earth is completely our own. After all, we each have a personal and unique set of challenges, backgrounds, and values. We know what we like and what we don't, what we believe in and who we love. We carve our own path through life, navigating it as best we can. We think because of this, that we are in control of our own destiny. Unfortunately, as someone who spends too much time in cemeteries, I can attest that is usually not the case.

The cemetery is the ultimate testament to the fact that we are all the same. We are all human beings made of flesh and blood, and therefore we all will meet the same fate. During the High Holidays, our tradition demands that we confront this reality. We ponder which amongst us will make it to the next year, and who will die? "Who by fire, who by the sword?"

Now I know this might not be the most uplifting of notes to read, but I think it's important. In fact, if there's one thing that being in the cemetery has taught me, it's that we need to appreciate the life that we do have. It's important to hug our loved ones and to keep up with

old friends. It's necessary to challenge ourselves to be the best versions of us that we can be. If that's what it means to do it "My Way", then I'm all for it!

Maybe it's because I'm a Rabbi, but I'm hoping one day to walk past a headstone that reads "I Did It God's Way." The Torah and its traditions are God's way of instructing us how to live and how to have happy and productive life. Perhaps if we begin to follow this set of instructions, we can live to our fullest potential.

This will be an event that everyone will enjoy attending.

Additionally, it is our pleasure to announce The Leon H. Steinberg Jewish Spirit Scholarship Fund at TBS. The Steinberg Scholarship Fund has been established to provide financial assistance to local Jewish youth looking to attend a Jewish based Summer Camp Program. 

LIVING THE PARSHA

At the Judy and Ronald Mack school for Religious Studies, we're always trying to find unique and innovative ways to teach our children Jewish ideas and traditions. Sometimes, this can be a challenge because the belief system of the ancient Israelites that the Torah talks about is significantly different than the religion of modern Judaism. So, how do we make it applicable to kids living in the 21st Century?

For the past four weeks at religious school on Monday nights, our students have been "Living the Parsha." We take themes and elements from the Torah portion for the week and come up with a series of activities or crafts for our children to engage with. This can be anything from building a pyramid out of sugar cubes to shooting a foam bow and arrow set. We even made (and then ate) a miniature altar out of fig newtons with an animal-cracker sacrifice!

Sometimes, we even try to make it challenging. On February 14th, students were given a set of materials to make a "Moses Mobile;" a car with sail made from popsicle sticks and tape. Their goal was to knock down the golden calf statue at the end of the course! I'm happy to say that our students were successful.

So yes, while elements of our tradition might be somewhat foreign to a modern learner, we here at Temple Beth Sholom's Religious School are never going to stop trying to make them as relevant as possible.





Should this be impossible, the hametz may be stored in such a way that we are sure not to use it during the holiday, and its ownership is transferred to a non-Jew until the holiday ends.

KNOW ALL PEOPLE BY THESE PRESENTS: That I, the undersigned, do hereby make and appoint Rabbi Felipe Goodman my true and lawful representative to act in my place and stead, for me and in my name and on my behalf, to sell all hametz owned and possessed by me, knowingly or unknowingly, as stated in the Torah and defined by the sages of Israel (e.g. hametz, hashash hametz—suspected hametz; and all kinds of ta'arovet hametz, hametz mixtures); also, hametz that tends to harden and to adhere to the surface of pans, pots or other cooking or eating utensils, of whatsoever nature, and to lease all places wherein the aforementioned hametz owned or possessed by me may be found, especially in the premises located at (your address here):
