MY TREE IN ISRAEL PARTNERSHIP!

ne of the most interesting aspects of being The Rabbi of Temple Beth Sholom is that every week we receive requests from different Jewish organizations wishing to partner with us in different areas. Many times, it is difficult to follow up on such partnerships because I find that they do not align with our mission and vision as a congregation. However, once in a while, a program comes along that is so good that it would be impossible, and frankly irresponsible, for me to pass on.

I want to bring your attention to a wonderful organization in Israel called MY TREE IN ISRAEL. Their purpose is very simple, yet beautiful. They want to bring together farmers in Israel with Jewish communities outside of Israel to form a partnership through which the farmers in Israel feel that we value their work, and at the same time, we out here feel a connection and feel the embrace of Israel in our lives.

This is now more important than ever. If you are like me, you are probably concerned about the direction the current Israeli government is taking. A governing coalition filled with ultra-Orthodox parties and religious extremists is not in the best interest of the Jewish people. This project is important because we get to support Israel in a way that is absolutely detached from politics. It is very important that at times like this when we feel there is very little tying us to Israel, we remain connected to the land and its people.

MY TREE IN ISRAEL gives us an opportunity to adopt an olive tree or a grapevine.

By doing so, we support our brothers and sisters who farm the land, and



we also get to taste the olive oil from our tree or the wine from our grapevine. It costs \$250.00 to adopt an olive tree, and you will receive six bottles of olive oil. It costs \$360.00 to adopt a grapevine, and you will receive six bottles of wine produced by a boutique winery in Israel. It all ships free to Temple Beth Sholom, where you will be able to pick it up when it arrives. If you would like to receive either olive oil or wine before Pesach, please be sure to fund your sponsorship before January 15, 2023.

There is more great news... For every partnership that our members sponsor, our congregation also receives a percentage as a contribution. It is really an incredible and innovative program through which we create a TRUE partnership that is completely free of any political implications.

hen I told the minyanaires that D.J. and I would be going to New York City for a conference, we immediately began talking about the weather.

After all, I had grown up in Texas — then moved to California for rabbinical school, and then moved to Nevada to work at Temple Beth Sholom. Obviously, none of these places were known for their extreme cold temperatures, so I had never bothered to actually buy a proper winter coat.

One of the gentlemen in the group was from the Bronx and was all too familiar with New York's cold weather. He told me he would bring me a warm jacket — and sure enough, the next day he brought in a garment that could fend off anything Jack Frost could bring. Two days later, another member, who had grown up in Chicago, also brought me a coat. I stood there amazed that two people could be so menschy, and could care so much for their rabbi, that they would literally give me their clothing.

Last month, we started the story of Joseph and his brothers in our Torah cycle. Much of the conflict in the story arises because Jacob loved his son Joseph more than anyone else, and to demonstrate this — he bought him a multi-colored garment to wear. In antiquity, dyes were hard to come by, so this item would have been hard or expensive to acquire. However, the act of giving the coat oftentimes gets overlooked — because of all the chaos it causes. To give someone a piece of clothing is actually a very beautiful and intimate gesture, and to give someone your clothing is especially endearing.

I have thought about the act of giving clothes, and this winter, I encourage us to donate our gently used clothing items to charities around town who will put them to good use. In this way, we too can show the world that we love our neighbors more than anything else. Not only will we be like Joseph, but we'll actually be like God.






